CEO is a transformational program for high school seniors from Edwardsville High School, Father McGivney Catholic High School and Metro-East Lutheran High School. During the course of their senior year, our students tour and connect with dozens of area businesses and guest speakers.

Together, students develop a class business venture in the fall and launch an individual business in the spring. Business concepts learned through the experiential CEO class are critical; the 21st century skills of problem-solving, teamwork, self-motivation, responsibility, higher-order thinking, communication, and inquiry are at the heart of a student's development throughout the program.

Through these interactions and experiences, our goal is to help our students develop an entrepreneurial mindset which, we believe, will help set them up for success no matter which career path they choose.

CEO aims to provide a comprehensive educational experience by equipping our students to become entrepreneurial thinkers who contribute to the economic development and sustainability of our community.

HISTORY

Edwardsville CEO first launched in 2018 with 9 students. Since that first year, we have grown to be able to accept 26 students in each graduating class. Our incoming class of 2025 will represent our 7th CEO class.

Brynna Archer - Team Toles








Jackson Carroll - Steatth Detailing






Melanie Wilson - Mel's Macarons
